

EXPENDITURES OF FUEL COSTS

The State of Alaska receives	\$0.50 per gallon
For maintenance, production and distribution	\$0.15 per gallon
Repay Permanent Fund loan	\$0.10 per gallon
Second Permanent Fund pay out	\$0.10 per gallon
Allowable profit for Service Stations	\$0.15 per gallon

THE Total cost for gasoline and diesel fuel in every part of Alaska will be \$1.00 per gallon.

In the calendar year 2007-8 the State of Alaska received 33,248,823 barrels of oil as Royalty oil.

If this Initiative was in affect then, it could have produced:

- 636,714,999 gallons of gasoline
- 306,221,678 gallons of diesel
- 127,010,512 gallons of jet fuel (to be sold at market value)
- 42,226,008 gallons of liquid petroleum gas
- 299,904,432 gallons of other various oil products

We can have lower fuel prices in Alaska! We can bring down the costs to heat our homes, businesses and schools. This Initiative could also produce a Second Permanent Fund check. The cost of delivery to service stations is figured at \$0.85 cents per gallon.

Any cities, boroughs, or townships in Alaska that have their own storage and distribution facilities can purchase gasoline and diesel fuel for \$0.85 cents per gallon for municipal uses.

The Glenallen/Copper River, Nenana/Healy and Kenai areas will have \$70 million dollars each allotted to add a 50 megawatt co-generation electrical plant next to the refineries that will be given to their local Electrical Co-op. The total of \$210 million dollars has been allotted for electrical plant construction in these three principal areas.
